# **Auditors' Report on the Annual Accounts**

(Free translation from the original in Spanish. In the event of discrepancy, the Spanish-language version prevails)

To the shareholders of Grifols, S.A.

We have audited the annual accounts of Grifols, S.A. (the Company) which comprise the balance sheet at 31 December 2008, the related income statement, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended and the notes thereto, the preparation of which is the responsibility of the Company's directors. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the annual accounts taken as a whole, based on our audit which was conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards in Spain, which require examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts in the annual accounts and assessing the appropriateness of their presentation, of the accounting principles applied and of the estimates employed.

The annual accounts for 2008 are the first the Company has prepared applying the Spanish General Chart of Accounts approved by Royal Decree 1514/2007. In accordance with section one of the fourth transitional provision of this Royal Decree, the annual accounts for 2008 have been considered as the opening annual accounts and therefore, do not include comparative figures. Note 28 "Aspects arising from transition to new accounting standards" presents the balance sheet and statement of profit and loss forming part of the 2007 annual accounts, which were prepared in accordance with the Spanish General Chart of Accounts in force for that year. This note also contains an explanation of the main differences between the accounting principles applied in the current year and those applied in the previous year, as well as a quantification of the impact of this change in accounting criteria on equity at 1 January 2008, which is the transition date. We express our opinion solely on the annual accounts for 2008. On 14 February 2008 we issued our unqualified audit report on the annual accounts for 2007, which were prepared in accordance with accounting principles prevailing that year.

In our opinion, these annual accounts for 2008 present fairly, in all material respects, the equity and financial position of Grifols, S.A. at 31 December 2008, and the results of its operations, changes in equity and cash flows for the year then ended, and contain sufficient information necessary for their adequate interpretation and understanding, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in Spain.

The accompanying directors' report for 2008 contains such explanations as the directors consider relevant to the situation of Grifols, S.A., the evolution of its business and other matters, but is not an integral part of the annual accounts. We have verified that the accounting information contained therein is consistent with that disclosed in the annual accounts for 2008. Our work as auditors is limited to the verification of the directors' report within the scope described in this paragraph and does not include a review of information other than that obtained from the accounting records of the Company.

# (1) Nature and Activities of the Company and Composition of the Group

- Grifols, S.A. (hereinafter the Company) was incorporated with limited liability under Spanish law on 22 June 1987. Its registered and tax offices are in Barcelona. The Company's authorized activity under its by-laws consists of providing corporate and administrative, management and control services, as well as investing in assets and property. Its principal activity involves rendering administrative, management and control services to its subsidiaries.
- The Company's registered offices are in Barcelona and its main business locations are in this city and in Parets del Vallés (Barcelona).
- Grifols, S.A.'s shares are listed on the Barcelona, Madrid, Valencia and Bilbao stock exchanges and on the electronic continuous stock market.
- In accordance with prevailing legislation, the Company is the Parent of a Group comprising the Company and the subsidiaries listed in note 10. In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in Spain, consolidated annual accounts must be prepared to present fairly the financial position of the Group, the results of operations and changes in its equity and cash flows. Details of interests in group companies are included in Appendix II.
- On 20 February 2009, the Company's Board of directors has approved the consolidated annual accounts of Grifols, S.A. and subsidiaries for 2008 under International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU, which show consolidated profit attributable to the Group of Euros 121,728 thousand and consolidated equity of Euros 481,279 thousand.
- At 31 December 2008 Grifols, S.A. does not comprise a decision-making unit along with other companies with registered offices in Spain pursuant to Standard 13 of the Standards for the Preparation of Annual Accounts.

# (2) Basis of preparation

## (a) Fair view

The accompanying annual accounts have been prepared on the basis of the accounting records of Grifols, S.A. The annual accounts for 2008 have been prepared in accordance with prevailing legislation and the new Spanish General Chart of Accounts (NPGC) to present fairly the equity and financial position at 31 December 2008 and results of operations, changes in equity, and cash flows for the year then ended. The annual accounts for 2008 are the first the Company has prepared applying the Spanish General Chart of Accounts approved by Royal Decree 1514/2007. In accordance with section one of the fourth transitional provision of this Royal Decree, the 2008 annual accounts have been considered as the opening annual accounts and therefore, do not include comparative figures. Note 28 "Aspects derived from transition to new accounting standards" presents the balance sheet and income statement forming part of the 2007 annual accounts approved by the shareholders at the annual general meeting held on 13 June 2008, which were prepared in accordance with the Spanish General Chart of Accounts in force during that year. This note also contains an explanation of the main differences between the accounting principles applied in the current year and those applied in the previous year, as well as a quantification of the impact of this change in accounting criteria on equity at 1 January 2008, which is the transition date and, therefore, the opening balance sheet date.

As explained in note 28 and in accordance with the first transitional provision of Royal Decree 1514/2007, the Company has opted to measure all assets in the opening balance sheet based on the accounting principles prevailing at 31 December 2007, except for financial instruments which are measured at fair value.

The Directors consider that the annual accounts for 2008 approved by them on 20 February 2009 will be approved by the Shareholders without any significant change.

## (b) Functional and presentation currency

The figures disclosed in the annual accounts are presented in Euros, the Company's functional and presentation currency, rounded off to the nearest euro.

# (c) <u>Critical aspects of the valuation and estimation of uncertainties and judgements used when applying accounting principles</u>

The preparation of annual accounts requires relevant accounting estimates, judgements and hypothesis in applying accounting principles. A summary of those aspects requiring a greater degree of judgement or which are more complex, or where the assumptions and estimates made are significant to the preparation of the annual accounts are as follows:

#### Notes to the Annual Accounts

## (i) Relevant accounting estimates and assumptions

The Company tests investments in group companies for impairment annually when the net value of the investment exceeds the carrying amount of the subsidiary. Fair value measurements require estimations made by management. The Company generally uses discounted cash flow methods to calculate these values. Discounted cash flow calculations are based on five-year projections approved by management. Cashflows take into account past experience and represent the management's best estimate of future market performance. Cash flows subsequent to the fifth year are extrapolated using individual growth rates. The key assumptions made when determining fair value include growth rates and the discount rate. Estimates, including the methodology employed, can have a significant impact on values and impairment losses.

The calculation of provisions for litigation is subject to a high degree of uncertainty. The Company recognises provisions for liabilities when an unfavourable outcome is highly probable and can be reasonably quantified. These estimates are subject to change based on new information received due to the stage of the legal process.

# (ii) Change in accounting estimate

Although estimates are calculated by the Company's Directors based on their best estimate available at 31 December 2008, future events may take place requiring these estimates to be modified in subsequent years. The effect on the annual accounts of modifications which, where applicable, result from adjustments to be made in subsequent years are recognised prospectively.

## (3) Distribution of Profit

# (4) <u>Significant Accounting Policies</u>

# (a) Foreign currency transactions, balances and cash flows

## (i) Foreign currency transactions, balances and cash flows

Foreign currency transactions have been converted into Euros using the average exchange rates for the previous month for all foreign currency transactions during the following month. This method does not differ significantly from applying the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies have been converted to Euros at the closing rate, while non-monetary assets and liabilities measured at historical cost have been converted at the exchange rate prevailing at the transaction date.

Non-monetary assets measured at fair value have been converted to Euros at the exchange rate at the date that the fair value was determined.

In the statement of cash flows, foreign currency transaction cash flows have been converted to Euros using the average exchange rates for the prior month for all the flows that occur during each month. This method does not differ significantly from applying the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.

#### Notes to the Annual Accounts

Exchange gains and losses arising on the settlement of foreign currency transactions and the conversion to Euros of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in profit or loss.

# (b) Intangible assets

Intangible assets are measured at cost or cost of production. Production costs are capitalised under the caption "Work performed by the entity and capitalised". Intangible assets are carried at cost, less any accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment valuation allowances.

Cost of production of intangible assets comprises the purchase price and any costs directly related to production.

Expenditure on activities that contribute to increasing the value of the Company's business as a whole, such as goodwill, trademarks and other similar items generated internally, as well as establishment costs, are recognised as expenses when incurred.

## (i) Software

Software acquired and developed by the Company is recognised to the extent that costs can be clearly allocated to the assets, and distributed over time to each project and when there is evidence of technical success and economic viability. Software maintenance costs are expensed when incurred.

### (ii) Subsequent expenditure

Subsequent expenditure on intangible assets is recognised in profit and loss, unless it increases the expected future economic benefits attributable to the intangible asset.

# (iii) <u>Useful life and amortisation rates</u>

Intangible assets with finite useful lives are amortised by allocating the depreciable amount of an asset on a systematic basis over its useful life, by applying the following criteria:

The depreciable amount of an intangible asset is the cost of acquisition or production.

The Company reviews the useful life and amortisation method for each intangible asset at each financial year end. Changes to initially-established criteria are recognised as a change in accounting estimates.

## (iv) Impairment losses

The Company measures and determines impairment valuation allowances to be recognised or reversed based on the criteria in section (e) Impairment of non-financial assets subject to depreciation or amortisation.

## (c) Property, plant and equipment

## (i) Initial recognition

Property, plant and equipment are measured at cost of acquisition or production, using the same criteria as for determining the cost of production of intangible assets. Capitalised production costs are recognised under the caption "Work performed by the entity" in the income statement. Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment valuation allowances.

The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment includes the costs of its dismantlement or removal and restoration of the site on which it is located, provided that the obligation is incurred as a consequence of having used the item.

## (ii) Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment are depreciated by allocating the depreciable amount of an asset on a systematic basis over its useful life. The depreciable amount is the cost of an asset. The Company determines the depreciation charge separately for each component of an item of property, plant and equipment with a cost that is significant in relation to the total cost of the asset and with a useful life that differs from the remainder of the asset.

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated using the following criteria:

The Company reviews useful lives and depreciation methods at each financial year end. Changes to initially established criteria are accounted for as a change in accounting estimates.

#### (iii) Subsequent costs

Subsequent to initial recognition of the asset, only the costs incurred which increase capacity or productivity or which lengthen the useful life of the asset are capitalised. The carrying amount of parts that are replaced is derecognised. Costs of day-to-day servicing are recognised in profit and loss as incurred.

## Impairment

The Company measures and determines impairment valuation allowances to be recognised or reversed based on the criteria in section (e) "Impairment of non-financial assets subject to depreciation or amortisation".

# (d) Investment property

The Company classifies property rented to its subsidiaries under this caption. All property is earmarked exclusively for own use or the use of group companies.

Property that is being constructed or developed for future use as investment property is classified as property, plant and equipment under development until construction or development is complete. Nevertheless, redevelopment work to extend or improve property is classified as investment property.

The Company measures and recognises investment property following the policy for property, plant and equipment.

Investment property is depreciated applying the following policies:

When the same property is occupied by the Company and one or more group companies, the part comprising the square metres occupied by the subsidiaries is classified as investment property while the part comprising the square metres occupied by the Company is classified as property, plant and equipment.

# (e) <u>Impairment of non-financial assets subject to depreciation or amortisation</u>

The Company evaluates whether there are indications of possible impairment losses on non-financial assets subject to amortisation or depreciation to verify whether the carrying amount of these assets exceeds the recoverable amount, which is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell, and its value in use.

Impairment losses are recognised in profit and loss.

At the end of each reporting period the Company assesses whether there is any indication that an impairment loss recognised in prior periods may no longer exist or may have decreased. Impairment losses on goodwill are not reversible. Impairment losses for other assets are only reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to calculate the recoverable amount of the asset.

A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss. The increase in the carrying amount of an asset attributable to a reversal of an impairment loss may not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, had no impairment loss been recognised.

After an impairment loss or reversal of an impairment loss is recognised, the depreciation (amortisation) charge for the asset is adjusted in future periods based on its new carrying amount.

However, if the specific circumstances of the assets indicate an irreversible loss, this is recognised directly in losses on the disposal of fixed assets in the income statement.

## (f) Leases

# (i) Lessee accounting records

The Company has rights to use certain assets through lease contracts.

Leases in which the Company assumes substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership are classified as finance leases, otherwise they are classified as operating leases.

#### - Finance leases:

At the commencement of the lease term, the Company recognises finance leases as assets and liabilities at the lower of the fair value of the leased asset and the present value of the minimum lease payments. Initial direct costs are added to the asset's carrying amount. Minimum lease payments are apportioned between the finance charge and the reduction of the outstanding liability. Interest is expensed using the effective interest method.

Contingent rents are recognised as an expense when it is probable that they will be payable.

The accounting policies applied to the assets used by the Company by virtue of finance lease contracts are the same as those set out in sections (c) and (d) (Property, plant and equipment and Investment property).

## - Operating leases

Lease payments under an operating lease, net of incentives received, are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

Contingent rents are recognised as an expense when it is probable that they will be incurred.

# (g) Financial instruments

## (i) Transition

As mentioned in note 28 and pursuant to the first transitional provision of Royal Decree 1514/2007, the Company has opted to measure all equity items in the opening balance sheet in accordance with the principles and standards prevailing at 31 December 2007, except for financial instruments which are measured at fair value.

## (ii) Classification and separation of financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified on initial recognition as a financial asset, a financial liability or an equity instrument in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement and the definitions of a financial liability, a financial asset and an equity instrument.

The Company classifies financial instruments into different categories based on the nature of the instruments and management's intentions on initial recognition.

#### Notes to the Annual Accounts

Purchases or sales of financial assets under conventional contracts, understood as those in which the reciprocal obligations of the parties must be consumed within the time frame established generally by regulation or convention in the marketplace concerned and cannot be settled by differences, are recognised using trade date accounting or settlement date accounting.

However, a contract which can be settled by differences is recognised as a derivative financial instrument from the date of contract to settlement.

# (iii) Offsetting principles

A financial asset and a financial liability are offset only when the Company currently has the legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and intends either to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

# (iv) Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables comprise trade and non-trade receivables with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market, other than those classified in other financial asset categories. These assets are recognised initially at fair value, including transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Nevertheless, financial assets which have no established interest rate, which mature or are expected to be received in the short term, and for which the effect of updating is immaterial, are measured at their nominal amount.

## (v) Available-for-sale financial assets

The Company classifies in this category debt securities and equity instruments which do not comply with the requirements for inclusion in the aforementioned categories.

Available-for-sale financial assets are initially recognised at fair value, plus transaction costs directly attributable to the acquisition.

After initial recognition, financial assets classified in this category are measured at fair value and any gain or loss is recognized in equity. Fair value is not reduced by transaction costs incurred on sale or disposal. On disposal of the financial assets amounts recognised in equity or the impairment loss are reclassified to profit or loss as described in section (g) Financial instruments, sub-section (viii) Impairment of financial assets. However, interest calculated using the effective interest method and dividends are recognised in profit and loss using the policy described in section (g) Financial instruments, sub-section (vii) Interest and dividends.

# (vi) Investments in group companies

Group companies are those over which the Company, either directly or indirectly, through subsidiaries, exercises control as defined in article 42 of the Spanish Commercial Code, or when the companies are controlled by one or various individuals or entities acting jointly or under the same management through agreements or statutory clauses.

### Notes to the Annual Accounts

Control is the power to govern the financial and operating policies of an entity or business so as to obtain benefits from its activities, in assessing control potential voting rights held by the Company or other entities that are exercisable or convertible at the end of each reporting period are considered.

Investments in group companies are initially recognised at cost, which is equivalent to the fair value of the consideration paid, including transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at cost net of any accumulated impairment losses.

If an investment no longer qualifies for classification under this category, it is reclassified as available-for-sale and is measured as such from the reclassification date.

## (vii) Interest and dividends

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Dividends from investments in equity instruments are recognised when the Company is entitled to receive them. If, as from I January 2008, the dividends are clearly derived from profits generated prior to the acquisition date because amounts higher than the profits generated by the investment since acquisition have been distributed, the carrying amount of the investment is reduced.

## (viii) Impairment of financial assets

A financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired and impairment losses are incurred if there is objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the asset and that event or events have an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset or group of financial assets that can be reliably estimated.

The Company recognises valuation allowances for impairment of loans and receivables and debt instruments when a reduction or delay is incurred in the estimated future cash flows, due to debtor insolvency.

For equity instruments, objective evidence of impairment exists when the carrying amount of an asset becomes irrecoverable due to a significant or prolonged decline in its fair value.

Investments in group companies

An asset is impaired when its carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount, the latter of which is understood as the higher of the asset's value in use or fair value less costs to sell.

Value in use is calculated based on the Company's share of the present value of future cash flows expected to be derived from ordinary activities and if applicable, from the disposal of the asset, or the estimated cash flow expected to be received from the distribution of dividends and, where applicable, the final disposal of the investment. Unless there is better evidence, equity is taken into consideration, corrected for any latent unrecorded goodwill existing on the measurement date.

#### Notes to the Annual Accounts

In subsequent years, reversals in impairment losses in the form of increases in the recoverable amount are recognised, up to the limit of the carrying amount that would have been determined for the investment if no impairment loss had been recognised.

The recognition or reversal of an impairment loss is recorded in the income statement.

The impairment allowance for an investment is limited to the amount of the investment.

## (ix) Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities, including trade and other payables, which are not classified as held for trading or as financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss, are initially recognised at fair value less any transaction costs that are directly attributable to the issue of the financial liability. After initial recognition, liabilities classified under this category are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Nevertheless, financial liabilities which have no established interest rate, which mature or are expected to be settled in the short term, and for which the effect of discounting is immaterial, are measured at their nominal amount.

## (h) Own equity instruments held by the Company

Equity instruments acquired by the Company are shown separately at cost of acquisition as a reduction in capital and reserves in the balance sheet. Any gains or losses on transactions with own equity instruments are not recognised in profit or loss.

Dividends relating to equity instruments are accounted for as a deduction in equity when approved by the shareholders.

# (i) Inventories

Inventories are initially measured at cost of purchase or production, and mainly comprise spares which are stored for less than a year.

The Company adjusts the value of inventories when cost exceeds market value.

## (i) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and demand deposits in financial institutions. They also include other short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value. An investment normally qualifies as a cash equivalent when it has a maturity of less than three months from the date of acquisition.

#### Notes to the Annual Accounts

## (k) Defined contributions

The Company recognises the contributions payable to a defined contribution plan in exchange for a service when an employee has rendered service to the Company. The contributions payable are recognised as an expense for employee remuneration, and as a liability after deducting any contribution already paid. If the contribution already paid exceeds the contribution due for service before the end of the period, the Company only recognises that excess as an asset to the extent that the prepayments will lead to, for example, a reduction in future payments or a cash refund.

# (l) Revenue from the rendering of services

Revenue from the rendering of services sale of goods is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Practically all services are rendered to group companies.

# (m) Income taxes

The income tax expense and tax income for the year comprises current tax and deferred tax.

Current tax assets or liabilities are measured at the amount expected to be paid to or recovered from the taxation authorities, using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date.

Current and deferred tax are recognised as income or an expense and included in profit or loss for the year, except to the extent that the tax arises from a transaction or event which is recognised, in the same or a different year, directly in equity, or a business combination.

Government assistance that is provided in the form of deductions and benefits in determining taxable income is recognised as a reduction in the income tax expense in the year in which they are accrued.

The Company and its Spanish subsidiaries Instituto Grifols, S.A., Laboratorios Grifols, S.A., Diagnostic Grifols, S.A., Movaco, S.A., Biomat, S.A., Logister, S.A., Grifols International, S.A., Grifols Engineering, S.A. and Grifols Viajes, S.A., file consolidated tax returns.

The accrued income tax expense for the companies forming the consolidated tax group is determined taking into account, in addition to the factors to consider in the case of individual taxation set out previously, the following:

- Temporary and permanent differences arising from the elimination of profits and losses on operations between Group companies, derived from the process of determining consolidated taxable income.
- Deductions and credits that correspond to each company forming the consolidated tax group; for these purposes, deductions and credits are allocated to the company that carried out the activity or obtained the profit necessary to obtain the right to the deduction or tax credit.

#### Notes to the Annual Accounts

A reciprocal credit and debit arises between the companies that contribute tax losses to the consolidated Group and the rest of the companies that offset those losses. Where a tax loss cannot be offset by the other consolidated Group companies, these tax credits for loss carryforwards are recognised as deferred tax assets under respective recognition criteria, considering the tax group as a taxable entity.

The Parent of the Group records the total consolidated income tax payable with a charge to receivables with group companies and associates.

The amount of the debt relating to the subsidiaries is recognised with a credit to payables with group companies.

# (i) Taxable temporary differences

Taxable temporary differences are recognised in all cases except when:

- They arise from the initial recognition of goodwill or an asset or liability in a transaction which is not a business combination and at the time of the transaction, affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit;
- They are associated with investments in subsidiaries over which the Company is able to control the timing of the reversal of the temporary difference and it is probable that the temporary difference will reverse in the foreseeable future.

# (ii) Deductible temporary differences

Deductible temporary differences are recognised provided that:

- -it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary difference can be utilised, unless the differences arise from the initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction which is not a business combination and at the time of the transaction, affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit.
- the temporary differences are associated with investments in subsidiaries to the extent that the difference will reverse in the foreseeable future and taxable profit will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised.

## (iii) Measurement

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the years when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted. The tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets or liabilities are also reflected in the measurement of deferred tax assets and liabilities.

## (iv) Offset and recognition

The Company only offsets deferred tax assets and liabilities if it has a legally enforceable right, when they relate to income taxes levied by the same taxation authority and on the same taxable entity.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognised on the balance sheet under non-current assets or liabilities, irrespective of the expected date of recovery or settlement.

## (n) Classification of assets and liabilities as current and non-current

- Liabilities are classified as current when they are expected to be settled in the Company's normal operating cycle, they are held primarily for the purpose of trading, or they are due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period.

## (o) Environmental issues

The Company takes measures to prevent, reduce or repair the damage caused to the environment by its activities.

Expenses derived from environmental activities are recognised as other operating expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

Long term assets acquired by the Company to minimise the environmental impact of its activity and protect and improve the environment, including the reduction and elimination of future pollution from the Company's activities are recognised as assets, applying the valuation, presentation and disclosure criteria described in section (c) Property, plant and equipment.

# (p) Related party transactions

Transactions between group companies are recognised at the fair value of the consideration given or received. The difference between this value and the amount agreed is recognised in line with the underlying economic substance of the transaction.

# (11) Risk Management Policy

## (a) Financial risk factors

The Company's activities are exposed to various financial risks: market risk (including currency risk, interest rate risk in fair value and price risk), credit risk, liquidity risk and interest rate risk in cash flows. The Company's global risk management programme focuses on uncertainty in the financial markets and aims to minimise potential adverse effects on the Company's profits. The Company uses derivatives to mitigate certain risks.

The Company's risk management policies are established in order to identify and analyse the risks to which the Company is exposed, establish suitable risk limits and controls, and control risks and compliance with limits. Risk management procedures and policies are regularly reviewed to ensure they take into account changes in market conditions and in the Company's activities. The Company's management procedures and rules are designed to create a strict and constructive control environment in which all employees understand their duties and obligations.

The Group's Audit Committee supervises how management controls compliance with the Group's risk management procedures and policies and reviews whether the risk management policy is suitable considering the risks to which the Group is exposed. This committee is assisted by Internal Audit which acts as supervisor. Internal Audit performs regular and ad hoc reviews of the risk management controls and procedures and reports its findings to the Audit Committee.

#### (i) Foreign exchange risk

The Company operates internationally and is therefore exposed to foreign exchange risk when operating with foreign currencies, especially the US Dollar. Foreign exchange risk affects recognised assets and liabilities and net investments in foreign companies.

The Company holds several investments in foreign operations, the net assets of which are exposed to foreign exchange risk. Foreign exchange risk affecting net assets of the Company's foreign operations in US Dollars are mitigated primarily managed through borrowings in the corresponding foreign currencies.

## (ii) Credit risk

# (iii) Liquidity risk

The Company applies a prudent policy to cover its liquidity risks based on having sufficient cash and marketable securities as well as sufficient financing through credit facilities to settle market positions.

Details of financial assets and financial liabilities by contracted maturity date are provided in notes (14) and (20).

## (iv) Cash flow and fair value interest rate risks

As the Company does not have a considerable amount of remunerated assets, income and cash flows from operating activities are not significantly affected by fluctuations in market interest rates.

Interest rate risks arise from other long-term and short-term borrowings. Borrowings at variable interest rates expose the Company to cash flow interest rate risks. The Company's policy involves contracting borrowings at variable interest rates.

The Company manages interest rate risks in cash flows through variable to fixed interest rate swaps. These interest rate swaps convert variable interest rates on borrowings to fixed interest rates. Generally the Company obtains other long-term borrowings with variable interest rates and swaps these for fixed interest rates. These are generally at lower rates than those which would have been obtained had the borrowings been obtained directly with fixed interest rates. Through interest rate swaps the Company undertakes to exchange the difference between fixed interest and variable interest with other parties on a half-yearly basis. The difference is calculated based on the contracted notional principal. The Company has an interest-rate swap for loans of Euros 50,000 thousand (see note 15).

At 31 December 2008 had interest rates been 10 base points higher, with the other variables remaining constant, profit after income tax would have been Euros 71 thousand lower, mainly because of higher financial expenses for borrowings at variable interest rates.

On 26 May 2008 the Company entered into a Club Deal refinancing agreement with 24 financial entities for Euros 350 million (including the option to draw down a tranche of the loan in US Dollars), in order to refinance the non-current syndicated loan existing at 31 December 2007. This loan provides the Group with a significant margin for leverage to carry out planned investment programmes.

This syndicated loan, which matures on 26 May 2013, is subject to compliance with certain financial ratio covenants. In accordance with the agreed-upon conditions, the level of compliance with financial ratios and levels is determined at year end. The Company is required to provide financial information to the lending banks within the six-month period subsequent to 31 December of each year of the duration of the contract.

At 31 December 2008 the Company fulfils the ratios established in this agreement.

Non-current and current loans and borrowings are presented net of loan arrangement costs at 31 December 2008 which amount to Euros 1,568 thousand and Euros 480 thousand, respectively.

#### (28) Aspects derived from the transition to the new Spanish General Chart of Accounts

As indicated in note 2, the annual accounts for 2008 have been considered as opening annual accounts, and therefore do not include comparative figures. This note contains the balance sheet and statement of profit and loss included in the annual accounts for 2007 approved by the shareholders on 13 June 2008, which were prepared applying the General Chart of Accounts prevailing at that date. These annual accounts included an explanation of the main differences between the accounting criteria applied in the prior year and the current standards, as well as the quantification of the impact of this change in accounting criteria on equity at 1 January 2008, which is the transition date and therefore the date of the opening balance sheet.

As permitted by transitional provision 1 of Royal Decree 1514/2007, the Company has opted to measure all equity items included in the opening balance sheet in accordance with the standards and principles prevailing at 31 December 2007, except for financial instruments which are measured at fair value.

#### (b) Reconciliation with the opening balance sheet

- 6. Regulations applicable to the appointment and replacement of the members of the Board of Directors and modifications to the Company's articles of association
- 6.1. Appointment and replacement of the members of the Board of Directors

The system for the appointment and replacement of the members of the Board of Directors is regulated by the Company's Articles of Association and the Board of Directors Regulation.

(a) Statutory rules

Article 20.- Composition and remuneration of the Board of Directors.— The legal management and representation of the Company will be the responsibility of a Board of Directors comprising a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of fifteen (15) board members.

Board members will be freely appointed and removed by the shareholders in a general meeting and will perform their duties for a period of five (5) years, without prejudice to their indefinite re-appointment for such periods.

(b) Rules regulating the Board of Directors

#### Article 18. Appointment of board members

- 1. Board members will be appointed by the shareholders in a general meeting or by the Board of Directors in accordance with the rules stipulated in the Spanish Companies Act.
- 2. Any proposals to appoint board members presented by the Board of Directors for consideration by the shareholders in general meetings and any appointment decisions made by the shareholders via the cooption powers with which they have been legally vested must be preceded by the corresponding proposal from the Appointments and Remunerations Committee.

When the Board of Directors do not follow the recommendations of the Appointments and Remunerations Committee, they must present their reasons for their action, which must be documented in minutes.

#### Article 19. Appointment of external board members

- 1. The Board of Directors and the Appointments and Remunerations Committee will, within the scope of their competence, endeavour to ensure that the potential candidates have recognised solvency, ability and experience, and will exercise due rigour when assessing candidates for the position of independent board member, as stipulated in Article 6 of this Regulation.
- 2. The Board of Directors cannot propose or appoint as independent board member any persons who are related to the management of the Company or have family, professional or trade links with the executive board members or the Company's senior management.

In particular, the following persons cannot be proposed or appointed as independent board members:

- (a) persons who have had a significant direct or indirect working, commercial or contractual relationship with the Company, its directors, board members representing shareholders or representing the interests of group companies, credit institutions which have a notable credit position with the Company, or entities that receive significant grants from the Company;
- (b) persons who are board members of another listed company which has board members representing shareholders in the Company;
- (c) persons related to executive board members, board members representing shareholders or members of the Company's management; for the purpose of the current Regulation, persons related to board members are considered to be those who were in the circumstances established in Article 127.3.5 of the Spanish Companies Act; and
- (d) persons with other relations with the Company which the Appointments and Remunerations Committee consider could affect their independence.

# Article 20. Re-appointment of board members

Any proposals to re-appoint board members which the Board of Directors decides to present in general shareholders meetings must be formally prepared and must include a report issued by the Appointments and Remunerations Committee evaluating the quality of work and dedication to the post of the board members proposed during the preceding mandate.

#### Article 21. Term of appointment

- 1. Board members will occupy their posts during the term established in the Company's Articles of Association and can be re-appointed.
- 2. Board members appointed through co-opting will occupy their posts until the first general shareholders' meeting.
- 3. When the Board of Directors receives a report from the Appointments and Remunerations Committee informing them that the Company's interests are at risk, any board member who completes the term of their appointment or leave their posts for any other reason will not be able to render services to another entity which is a competitor of the Company for the period established by the Board of Directors, which cannot, in any event, exceed two (2) years.

Despite the above, if it considers it necessary, the Board of Directors can waive the board member leaving the Company of this obligation.

#### Article 22. Resignation or dismissal of board members

- 1. Board members must resign from their posts when the term of their appointment expires and when the shareholders so decide in accordance with the legal or statutory powers vested.
- 2. The Board of Directors will abstain from proposing the dismissal of external board members (board members representing shareholders or independent board members) to the shareholders in the general meeting prior to completion of the statutory period for which they were appointed, unless exception or justified circumstances prevail and a report has been received from the Appointments and Remunerations Committee.
- 3. Board members must offer their resignation to the Board of Directors and formalise, where necessary, their resignation in the following circumstances:
- (a) When they resign from the executive positions with which they were associated on being appointed as board members, unless expressly ratified by the Board of Directors subsequent to obtaining a non-binding report from Appointments and Remunerations Committee.
- (b) when they are found to be in a position which is incompatible or prohibited by law:
- (c) when they have been accused of an alleged crime or receive a committal for trial order for any of the crimes listed in Article 124 of the Spanish Companies Act, or face disciplinary proceedings for a serious or very serious infraction conducted by the supervisory authorities;
- (d) When they receive serious warning from the Audit Committee for having breached their obligations as board members.
- (e) when their position on the Board of Directors could put the Company's interests at risk or when the reasons why they were appointed no longer prevail; and
- (f) in the case of a board members representing shareholders, when the shareholder whose interests are represented on the Board of Directors sells its investment in the Company or reduces its investment to a level below which its representation on the Board of Directors is no longer justified.
- 4. When a board member leaves the post as a result of resignation or any other reason, an explanation for the reasons must be given in a letter to all the board members through the Chairman and the Secretary to the Board of Directors.

# 6.2. Modification to the Articles of Association

Modification to the Articles of Association must fulfil the general prerequisites established in Articles 103 and 144 of the Spanish Companies Act.

7. Board members' powers, especially those relating to the possibility of issuing or repurchasing shares

# 7.1. Powers of the members of the Board of Directors

In accordance with Article 20 of the Company's Articles of Association, the Board of Directors is responsible for managing and representing the Company.

# 7.2. Powers regarding the issue or repurchase of shares

In the general meeting held on 13 June 2008, the shareholders authorised the Board of Directors to acquire through sale and purchase transactions, share swaps, awards in settlement or any other method established by law, treasury shares in the Company or subscription rights either directly or through its subsidiaries, within the limits and prerequisites established below:

- (i) The par value of the shares acquired, plus those already held by the Company or its subsidiaries, cannot exceed 5% of the Company's share capital at any time.
- (ii) The acquisition must enable the Company to establish the reserve prescribed in standard 3 of Article 79 of the Spanish Companies Act, without reducing share capital or restricted legal or statutory reserves.
  - (iii) The shares acquired must by fully paid.
  - (iv) The maximum acquisition price must be the price listed on the stock market on the day the acquisition takes place, or the price authorised by the Spanish National Securities Market Commission. The minimum price must be 100% of the par value of each share.
  - (v) The present authorisation is granted for a maximum of 18 months.
  - (vi) Shares acquired can be issued to workers or directors of the Group either directly or as a result of the exercising of share options held by these individuals.
- 8. Any significant agreements signed by the Company which enter into force, are modified or expire as a result of a change in control in the Company deriving from a public takeover bid and the effects thereof, except when their distribution would severely prejudice the Company. This exception will not be applicable when the Company is legally bound to publish this information.

No significant agreements are in force that could be modified or expire as a result of changes in the control of the Company.

9. Agreements between the Company and its board members and directors or employees which establish the payment of indemnities in the event that these individuals resign or are unfairly dismissed or if the labour relationship is extinguished due to a public takeover bid

Six of the Group's senior management (who are not board members) have indemnity clauses which are applicable if they are unfairly dismissed or there is a change in management. These indemnities amount to two years' salary, including fixed and variable remuneration.

The employment contracts for the rest of the executive board members and senior management do not include indemnity clauses other than those established by prevailing labour legislation.
